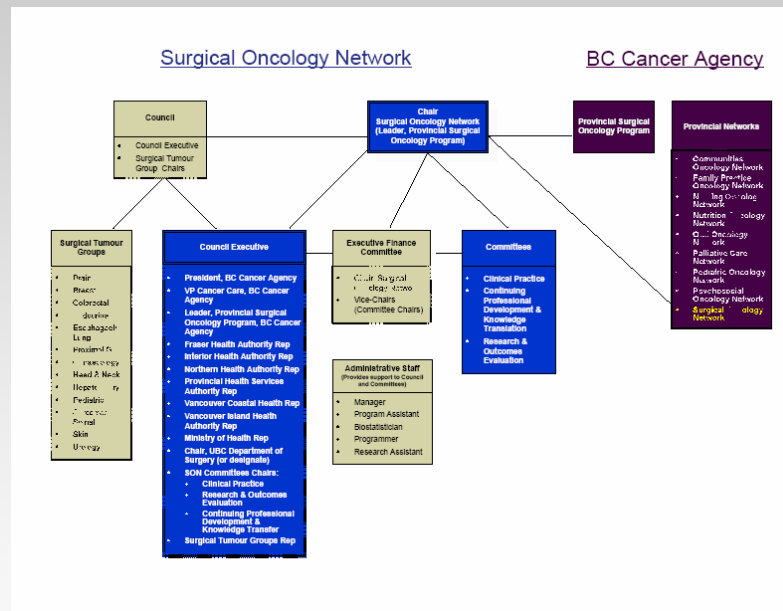
# SON Mandate

- SON established in 2001.
- Provide strong linkages with surgeons and hospitals across the province, including the BC Cancer Agency's cancer centres and clinics.
- Establish a structure and system to enable the integration of quality surgical oncology services into the formal cancer care system.

# Main Functions of SON

- Develop communications tools to enhance surgical decision making provincially.
- Participate in the identification and/or development of peer- reviewed, evidence-based guidelines based on 'best practice' principles.
- Develop high quality continuing education programs that meets standards of Royal College of Physicians & Surgeons.
- Conduct regionally based research and outcome analyses to provide vital information for Network initiatives.

# Council Roles/Functions

- **Council Executive** - Sets priorities for the Network.
- **Council** - Assists with planning, implementation and promotion of activities for the Network.
- **Surgical Tumour Groups** - Advise on issues and challenges in the surgical management of patients within each tumour grouping to improve the surgical management of oncology patients.

# Roles/Functions cont'd

## Committees

- **Executive Finance Committee** - Sets the financial plan for the Network's annual activity plan in accordance with the annual operating budget (approx. \$90k for expenses)
- **Clinical Practice Committee**
  - Develops and promotes surgical quality improvement, practice guidelines and standards in surgical oncology.
  - Works closely with the ROE Committee on developing outcomes reporting mechanisms and models.

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# Roles/Functions cont'd

## Committees

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- **CPD-KT Committee**
  - Provide practical educational opportunities in surgical oncology.
  - Offer opportunities that are accredited for maintenance of certification.
  - Link with existing educational opportunities provided by provincial surgical associations.
  - Communicate relevant educational information through the SON newsletter and website.

# New Resident Travel Award

- BC Surgical Oncology Network Resident Travel Award for BC Surgery Residents & Fellows:

- Applicants must be UBC surgical resident or fellow (any surgical discipline is eligible).
- No predetermined number of awards each year.
- Funded up to a maximum of \$1000.
- Total annual funding for all awards \$5000.
- Award will cover registration, airfare & hotel costs.
- Research must be in surgical oncology.
- Application must be made prior to attending a conference.
- Deadlines are: May 1 and November 1

# Rectal Cancer Monitoring Study Overview

- Initiated in October 2003 to collect information on rectal cancer surgeries and patient outcomes (T. Phang and Colorectal STG).
- A 1996 review of BC rectal cancer patients had revealed a high rate of positive surgical resection margins for distal rectal location.
- Overall local recurrence was 16% and 27% in stage 3 cancers.
- To improve outcomes, educational workshops were held 2002/03 to promote recommended management protocol to increase use of pre-operative imaging, pre-operative radiation and total mesorectal excision (TME).

# Rectal Cancer Monitoring Study Overview cont'd

- To assess whether local recurrence had changed, a second audit was conducted on a cohort of patients who had rectal cancer surgery between October 1, 2003 and September 30, 2004.
- Patient outcomes were measured by obtaining data and following this cohort for two years post-operatively (approx. 400 patients).
- 91% of patients have been followed for at least 2 years for recurrence and survival.

# Rectal Cancer Monitoring Study Preliminary Results

- Pelvic recurrence overall was 7% and 10% in Stage 3 cancers - significantly lower than in 1996 ( $p=0.03$ ).
- 49% of patients received pre-op adjuvant RT: pelvic recurrence in these patients was 5.2% compared to 9.0% for patients who received surgery alone.
- 33% received adjuvant chemotherapy.
- 33% had a permanent colostomy.
- Conclusion: Pelvic recurrence has improved.
- Abstract has been submitted to American Society of Colorectal Surgeons.

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# ROE Project Guidelines & Application

- To assist with developing cancer surgery quality improvement projects.
- Help to obtain data for pilot or feasibility studies or communication and education initiatives.
- Provide in-kind support - research design, statistical analysis, administrative/organizational support.
- Project leader must be a surgeon practising oncology.
- Two-stage application process:
  - Feasibility Application - reviewed by ROEC Chair and Coordinator
  - Full Proposal – for approved feasibility applications
  - Details in meeting folder and on website

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# Data Request to Ministry of Health

- Purpose: to measure cancer surgery outcomes for quality improvement, knowledge transfer and resource planning purposes.
- Formal process stipulated in Memorandum of Understanding between MOH and BCCA - 2006/07.
