	<p>Dr. Raziya Mia – Medical Education Lead, BC Cancer Primary Care Program</p> <p>Dr. Raziya Mia is Medical Education Lead for BC Cancer’s Family Practice Oncology Network. She is the physician lead for the Network’s education and CME programming including its GPO Education Program, Family Practice Oncology CME Day, GPO Case Study Day, and Oncology CME Webcasts. Dr. Mia worked as a GPO at BC Cancer – Abbotsford between September 2008 and March 2019. Previously, she maintained a long-time family practice in Kamloops where she also participated in the CME Committee at Royal Inland Hospital. She has also served as a board member with the BC College of Family Physicians and is a Clinical Instructor with the University of British Columbia Medical School’s Department of Family Practice. 	<p>Facilitator: Dr. Mary Georgilas, General Practitioner in Oncology (GPO), BC Cancer – Vancouver</p> <p>Dr. Mary Georgilas studied medicine at UBC and completed her family practice residency at St. Paul’s Hospital in 1997. After working in general practice for several years, she joined Vancouver General Hospital’s Leukemia/BMT outpatient clinic as a Clinical Associate. 	<p>Supporting Specialist: Dr. Karen Gelmon, Medical Oncologist, BC Cancer – Vancouver</p> <p>Dr. Gelmon is a Professor of Medicine at UBC and a Medical Oncologist at BC Cancer – Vancouver, combining clinical and translational research. She is currently Chair of the UBC/BC Cancer Research Ethics Board. In 2018 she was elected as a Fellow of the Canadian Academy of Health Sciences. She has been Academic Head of UBC’s Division of Medical Oncology, Co-Chair of the Breast Site Committee for the National Cancer Institute of Canada (NCIC) Clinical Trials Group and a member of the NCI Breast Steering Committee, and of the BIG (Breast International Group) Executive Board Group. She sits on the NCIC-Clinical Trials Group IND executive and is a past Chair of this committee. She has been a Komen scholar and member of the Scientific Advisory Council for Komen, and Co-Chair of the Scientific Advisory Council of the Ontario Institute of Cancer Research. She sits on the International Advisory Board of <i>The Lancet</i>, <i>The Oncologist</i> and <i>Clinical Breast Cancer</i>. She is a reviewer for journals and grant review panels. She is an active teacher interested in education of health care professionals and the public, and has published extensively with over 250 publications. She was the recipient of a YWCA Woman of Distinction award in 2003. She is the mother of two daughters and is active on volunteer boards for the arts community in Vancouver.</p>

15:45 – 16:45 Case Studies in Pancreatic Cancer



Facilitators: Drs. Willem Prinsloo and Aléjandra Farias Godoy, GPOs, Campbell River

Dr. Willem Prinsloo is the GP Physician Lead, Shared Care Projects, and Divisions Advisory Committee Member, Campbell River. Willem obtained his medical degree from University of the Orange Free State, South Africa in 1998 and immigrated to Canada in 2002. He began practicing family medicine in rural Saskatchewan where he worked in over 30 communities with a population of less than 1,500. Since 2007 he has practiced family medicine in Campbell River where he is a GPO and serves patients from Campbell River, North Vancouver Island, and the Discovery Islands. He provides palliative consultations for complex patients, and recently completed a Shared Care Project initiating a pre-surgery prehabilitation plan based on Enhanced Recovery after Surgery principles. Willem works as a Ski-Doc and also enjoys fishing, reading world news and politics, and supporting his children's athletic pursuits. He is a graduate of the General Practice Service Committee's Leadership Development Program and is excited to share his experience as a leader influencing change.



Dr. Farias comes from Chile, where she trained to become a general practitioner. She came to Vancouver where she completed MSc and PhD degrees in cardiac rehabilitation. Dr. Farias then went on to complete Family Medicine at UBC. She completed the GPO Education Program in May 2018 while working as a family physician in Campbell River. She now works as a GPO in North Island Hospital Campbell River & District and in North Island Hospital Comox Valley. She is also a part of the local palliative care team and provides MAID.



Supporting Specialist: Dr. Daniel Renouf, Medical Oncologist, BC Cancer – Vancouver

Dr. Daniel Renouf is a Medical Oncologist at BC Cancer – Vancouver, an Assistant Professor at UBC’s, Department of Medicine, and Co-Director of Pancreas Centre BC. He received his Doctor of Medicine from the University of Alberta and completed his internal medicine and medical oncology training at UBC and BC Cancer. He undertook further training in early drug development and gastrointestinal oncology at Princess Margaret Hospital and the University of Toronto, and obtained a Master’s of Public Health from Harvard University. Dr. Renouf’s research interests include developmental therapeutics, genomics, and biomarker development within gastrointestinal cancers, with a focus on pancreatic cancer. Within the field of drug development, he has taken on a leadership role within BC Cancer’s Phase I Program, and has published several manuscripts on early phase clinical trials. His other research interests are in genomics, biomarkers, and drug development in pancreatic cancer. He is currently involved in a number of studies including an investigator initiated phase II protocol of a novel agent in advanced pancreatic cancer, and a pilot study of real-time interpretation of whole genome DNA and RNA sequencing to direct therapy in advanced cancers.

Dr. Cathy Clelland obtained medical training at the University of Alberta and her Family Medicine residency at Misericordia Hospital in Edmonton. She practiced full service family medicine in BC beginning in 1986 in Prince George, then in Kelowna, and finally in Coquitlam. She joined the Board of the Society of General Practitioners of BC in 1997, was president in 2002/03 and Executive Director from 2004 – 2013.
