## LUNG SCREEN RESULTS:

The radiologist considers you to have a low chance of lung cancer, but recommends continued monitoring of your lungs. These results have been sent to your health care provider.

## **NEXT STEPS:**

Although a lung screening CT scan is very effective at finding lung cancer early, some cancers may be missed. If you develop any new symptoms such as shortness of breath, chest pain, or coughing up blood, please see your health care provider right away, even if you have had a recent lung screening CT scan.

We recommend you return to the Lung Screening Program in **12** months for routine screening. Your lung scan shows a low chance of cancer, but we would like to keep an eye on the health of your lungs. You will receive a reminder letter from the Lung Screening Program when it is time to return for your next CT scan. Screening works best when you receive regular CT scans to see if there are any new spots or changes to existing spots since your last scan. This is why it's important to return for lung screening when you're due.

Stopping smoking doubles the benefits of lung screening and significantly improves your lung health. Please see the enclosed brochure for information and resources on smoking cessation. Studies have found prescription drugs such as Varenicline can improve your chances of quitting. We recommend you reach out to your health care provider to discuss smoking cessation prescription drugs that may be covered by the BC Smoking Cessation Program.
