

## Statistics by Cancer Type - Multiple Myeloma

### General Summary

In 2020, an estimated 470 British Columbians will be newly diagnosed with multiple myeloma.

An estimated 84% of those who will be diagnosed with multiple myeloma will be over the age of 60 when they are diagnosed.

One in 147 females and one in 107 males is expected to develop multiple myeloma during their lifetime.

One in 243 females and one in 188 males is expected to die of multiple myeloma.
